Why use streaming for other events

- Increase your return on investment for equipment you already own
- Expand your audience beyond your weekly service
- Additional revenue opportunity
- Increase engagement with your congregation



Ideas for streaming beyond the service

- Weddings
- Baby dedication, baptisms and christenings, Bah mitzvahs
- Concerts, choir solos
- Children's pageants, holiday plays
- Guest speakers, recognition presentations
- Using video in other ministries
 - Women's bible study leaders testimonies
- Also can be used for overflow seating for regular weekly broadcast



Overflow seating broadcasting

- Sending the Wirecast signal to a an overflow room
 - Wirecast Studio GPU output
 - Wirecast Pro Blackmagic Design output
 - Network output (CDNs, LAN streaming)
- Sending audio + video to more than one location on premises
- Using virtual camera with social media (Google +, Skype, FB)

Considerations for special events

- Camera placement for up close shots
 - Don't let camera position interrupt the event
 - Batteries vs. plugs
 - Cable lengths
- Indoors vs. outdoor events
- Audio, audio, audio
- Lighting, sun position, wind, auto-focus settings
- Bandwidth, Internet connection



How to Choose the Right Delivery Method for Your Church

- Internal streaming server (Wowza, etc.) vs. external (CDN, streaming platform, niche platform)
- Cost
 - Free vs. Paid vs. subscription
 - Free trials
- Ease of set-up, ease of use
- Features
 - Multiple streams, Adaptive Bit Rate (ABR), multidevice
 - Social, chat, embedding etc.
 - Archiving for on-demand viewing









What can you do with Wowza Streaming Engine?

Case Study: Wayfarers Chapel

- **Challenge:** Provide live streaming and recorded video for several hundreds of weddings a year.
- Solution: Streamlined workflow including Wirecast live streaming with local recording
- Results: With a team of 2, they live stream multicamera events, record the live stream, and present a quality wedding video on DVD by the time the couple arrive at the reception
