Installation

This section describes how to remove the PRISM MPP SDI / IP Waveform Monitor from the shipping box and clean it. Basic operating methods are also listed.

Initial Product Inspection

Inspect the product when you receive your instrument:

- 1. Inspect the shipping carton for external damage, which may indicate damage to the instrument.
- 2. Remove the PRISM from the shipping carton and check the instrument has not been damaged in transit. Prior to shipment the instrument is thoroughly inspected for mechanical defects. The exterior should not have any scratches or impact marks.

Note: Save the shipping carton and packaging materials for instrument repackaging in case shipment becomes necessary.

- 3. Verify the shipping carton contains the instrument, the standard accessories, and product documentation.
- **4.** Verify that all the product options you ordered are installed:
 - **a.** After you install and power-on the instrument, select the **Settings** icon(**ELS**).



b. Select **Utilities** and then select **Options**.

The display lists all the installed product options (for example, MPSDP-IP-MEAS) and the license expiration dates. If an expiration reads "Permanent" then the license will not expire.

Exterior Cleaning

The instrument exterior was inspected for debris when it was shipped. If necessary, you can clean the exterior of the instrument.



WARNING: To prevent injury or death, power off the instrument and disconnect it from line voltage before cleaning.

Clean the exterior surfaces of the chassis with a dry lint-free cloth or a soft-bristle brush. If any dirt remains, use a cloth or swab dipped in a 75% isopropyl alcohol solution. Use a swab to clean narrow spaces around controls and connectors. Do not use abrasive compounds on any part of the instrument that may be damaged by it.



CAUTION: Avoid the use of chemical cleaning agents that might damage the plastics used in the instrument. Use only deionized water when cleaning the front-panel buttons. 
Cooling Requirements

The instrument must have adequate cooling, described in the table, for safe operation.




WARNING: To prevent injury or damage to the instrument, do not carry the PRISM by the small handles on the front of the instrument. These handles are for pulling the instrument out of a rack installation and are not intended to be used for carrying the instrument.

1. Insert the MPP into the rack. The instrument is shipped with the front mounting brackets installed. Rear mounting brackets are not required.



2. Use a Phillips-head screw driver and 4 truss-head screws (10-32 X 0.625) to connect the brackets of the MPP assembly to the rack.



SFP module

Operations

This section describes the basic operations and uses of the unit. For detailed explanation of how to use it, consult the user manual.

Power-on and Power-off Procedures

This describes how to apply power to the instrument, and how to power-on and poweroff the instrument.

Power Cord Installation


This instrument is powered by an AC power source. Connect the power cord to the power connector on the rear panel of the instrument. The power connector is keyed to be directional, with the flat portion of the power cord housing facing the left of the instrument (as viewed from the rear). When fully inserted, the power cord housing latches onto the instrument power connector.



CAUTION: To minimize the risk of damage to the instrument, we strongly recommend the power cord be connected to the instrument before the power cord is connected to the AC power source.

Power-on Procedure

- 1. Apply power to the instrument. If the PRISM was previously powered off by a power interruption or by removing the power cord from the rear of the instrument, the instrument will power on when power is reapplied.
- **2.** Press the power button on the instrument front panel to turn the instrument on. The power button blinks during the initial power-on sequence and then turns on during the normal instrument operation.





Power-off Procedure

1. Press the power button to turn the instrument off or select **Settings**, select **Utilities**, select **Power**, and then select **Power Down Now**.

The power button blinks and then turns off.




CAUTION: To prevent data loss, we strongly recommend you first shut down the instrument before disconnecting the power cord.

2. To completely remove power from the instrument, disconnect the power cord from the instrument. The power cord has a locking mechanism to keep it attached to the instrument. Push the button on the cord housing to release the locking mechanism.



Display Elements

Methods of Operation

This section describes the primary methods of operating the instrument:

- Keyboard and mouse
- External touchscreen display or non-touchscreen display

It also explains methods of controlling the instrument remotely:

- Remote Control through WebRTC
- Remote Control through VNC or web browser
- Remote Control through API or NMOS

Keyboard and Mouse

You can use a USB keyboard and mouse to operate the instrument. The mouse needs to have a scrolling wheel to access all of the menu selections. Click on applications to perform actions like you would on the touch panel.

Connect the keyboard and mouse to any of the available USB ports.

External Display

An external touchscreen or non-touchscreen display can be connected to control the instrument. Two connections are available for each display:

- Connect the DisplayPort output from the PRISM to the input on the external display.
- Connect the touch screen output of the external display (if available) to any USB port on the PRISM.
- If the display is not touchscreen capable, connect a keyboard and mouse to operate the instrument.

Note: The instrument works best with a 1920×1080 capable monitor.

Note: It is recommended that you plug in the external monitors before turning on the instrument. This will ensure that the monitors are properly identified and configured.

Note: It is recommended that you use external DP monitors to avoid the use of DP adapters such as HDMI-to-DP. Not all DP adapters will work with the MPP product.

If the display is touchscreen capable, use these gestures on the display to perform these functions:

- Touch or tap the screen to select display elements.
- Double tap an application banner to toggle the display between four-tile and a fullscreen display of the selected application.
- Swipe up or down, or left or right as necessary to navigate menus and preset listings and to view additional application information.
- Some applications support pinch and zoom.



Note: The terms "tap," "swipe," and "pinch" apply to the touchscreen on the instrument. If you are using a mouse and keyboard you must "click," "scroll," and use the scroll wheel on the mouse.

Manage Applications

There are several places applications can be selected, several ways to arrange applications, and applications can be personalized. This section explains how to use these tools.

The example of the Application menu has all the All Applications menu open in front of 4 tiled applications. The All Application menu changes based on the options purchased. The Application menu, at the bottom of the screen, can be personalized.



Select Applications

You can select applications for use from the Applications menu—a list of tools in the Status bar for applications in the tiles—or from the All Applications menu—the complete list of applications.

- 1. Select the Tiles icon () to open the Application menu.
- **2.** Select the tile in the display to show the new application.
- **3.** Select an application from the application tool bar.
- **4.** If an application is not available on the application tool bar, select the All Applications icon (IIII), at the right of the application menu. The All Application menu opens with all available applications visible.
- **5.** Select the application.
- **6.** Close the All Application menu.



Arrange Applications

Applications can be arranged in a quarter-screen tile, half-screen, and full-screen. Some displays have a reset tool.

Full-screen Tile

Double select, in an application tile, to change the application display to full screen. Double select a full-screen application to return it to it's previous size. This works on both guarter-screen and half-screen tiles.

Half-screen Tile

- Select the half-screen icon () in the menu bar to change the selected tile to vertical-extended mode. This only changes a quarter-screen tile to half-screen.
- When an application display is in vertical-extended mode (half-screen), select the collapse icon () in the menu bar to return to quarter tile mode. This only changes a half-screen tile to quarter-screen.

Reset Application

If available at the top-right of an application tile, select the reset icon () to clear or reset the run time of the application.

Set Up Application Menu

You can set what applications appear on the Application menu, the list of tools in the Status bar.

- **1.** Select the **Tiles** icon () to open the Application menu.
- **2.** At the right of the Application menu, select the All Applications icon (\boxed{\omega}).
- 3. In the All Application menu, select Edit.

Note: Up to 8 applications can be listed on the application tool bar. The number by each application notes the location of the application on the application tool bar.

- Click an application marked with a number to remove it from the Application menu.
- Click an application that is not marked with a number to add it to an empty space in the Application menu.
- **4.** When the applications in the Application menu are correct, select **Save**.
- **5.** Close the All Applications menu.

Find or Change Hostname, Password, and IP Address

This section explains how to find the hostname, password, and IP address of a PRISM. And it explains how and where to change the hostname and password.






- 1. On the PRISM monitor to change, select the **Settings** icon (**SS**).



- 3. The IP address can be set by DHCP or manually in the CONTROL IP PORT tab.



Remote Control through WebRTC

When the PRISM monitor is connected to an Ethernet network, you can use a computer connected to the same network to remotely control the instrument in a web browser using WebRTC.

Connect to the PRISM through WebRTC:

1. In a web browser, enter the hostname or IP address of the PRISM. See Find or Change Hostname, Password, and IP Address.

When the PRISM is connected, the PRISM HOME page is displayed.

- 2. Select Remote-WebRTC.
 - A login web page displays.
- **3.** Enter the password for that instrument in the Password field.
- **4.** The User Name is for the WebRTC chat tool. Enter a name if needed.



5. Select **WebRTC Connect**.



Remote Control through VNC Operation

When the PRISM is connected to an Ethernet network, you can use a computer connected to the same network to remotely control the instrument in a web browser or in a VNC client, such as VNC Viewer.

VNC Client

When using VNC for extended periods of time, we recommend using a VNC client:

- 1. Open a VNC client, enter the IP address or hostname of the instrument in the VNC Server search bar, and press **Return**. See *Find or Change Hostname, Password, and IP* Address.
- 2. If necessary, enter the password for the PRISM and select OK. The VNC client connects to the instrument in a separate window that appears exactly like the instrument display.

Web Browser

Connect to the instrument through a web browser:

1. Open a web browser and enter the hostname or IP address from the instrument. See Find or Change Hostname, Password, and IP Address.

The PRISM HOME page displays.

2. Select Remote noVNC Access.

A noVNC page displays.

3. Select Connect.

A login page displays.



4. Enter the password for that instrument in the Password field and select Send Credentials.



To adjust the scale of the PRISM tiles (if the tiles do not all fit on the display):


1. In the PRISM web interface, select the control tab on the left side of the tiles to open the noVNC Settings.



2. Select the Settings icon in the noVNC Settings.



3. In the Scaling Mode menu, select **Local Scaling**. The tiles resize to fit the web browser window.



4. Select the Settings icon again to close the Settings menu.

Remote Control through API

The PRISM can be controlled through API commands over the network. Although API operation does not allow you to fully interact with the instrument, it is useful for making changes in a production automation environment.

The available API commands can be displayed in the PRISM Home page:

- 1. Open a web browser and enter the hostname or IP address of the instrument. See Find or Change Hostname, Password, and IP Address.
- 2. Select API Help Page to view all available API commands.

API commands use HTML GET/POST methods.

Remote Control through NMOS
